Why I don't Declaw Cats

As we all know, scratching is an absolutely normal behavior in felines. It's helpful to sharpen nails and also to mark territory. Cats also use their nails as a mechanism of defense in fights or tree climbing. Declawing simply goes against feline nature. It's cruel and it should not be done. Over the years I have witness heart-breaking cases involving declawing gone wrong.

After declawing cats can experience intense pain, severe hemorrhage, lameness in affected limbs, infections and behavioral disorders.

Declawing should be limited to pathological conditions that may require amputation of the affected phalange.
